Dear Parents/Guardians,

A team of teachers and students went on a five-day cultural immersion and service-learning trip to Baray, Cambodia in the fourth week of the June holidays. The team engaged with two local schools and visited an organisation supporting individuals with special needs. The programme encompassed various activities including cultural exchanges with the locals, teaching conversational English, and learning basic Khmer language. The teachers and students also completed a mural painting for one of the schools, and distributed food packages and clothes to families in need. This initiative, part of our school's internationalisation efforts to develop citizens with a global outlook, proved invaluable in fostering cross-cultural understanding. It exemplified our students' commitment to community service while creating meaningful connections with others.

July promises to be an exciting month, so my advice will be for the girls to pace themselves well for the learning that is coming. Some highlights in July include the Youth Day Celebrations and Spirit Week activities, the Racial Harmony Day Commemoration and also the highly anticipated Annual Sports Day.

1. Temperature Taking Exercise

4. GCE N and O-Level English Language and Mother Tongue Oral Examinations

6. Racial Harmony Day Commemoration

Our school will commemorate Racial Harmony Day across two days - Friday, 18 July and Monday, 21 July. This year's commemoration centres on the theme "Our People, Our Food, Our Tapestry", complementing our Total Defence Day's emphasis on food resilience. We will explore how our food both connects our communities and mirrors Singapore's multicultural identity.

On 18 July, cohort-based activities will be conducted. On 21 July, we will celebrate our cultural heritage through traditional costumes and local delicacies. These experiences aim to demonstrate how shared food traditions can strengthen Singapore's social fabric and build a more cohesive society.

Students are welcome to wear their ethnic costumes on 21 July. They will receive guidance on appropriate dress code and conduct, along with detailed programme information, prior to the event.

7. Sports Day

To encourage a positive attitude towards physical fitness, sportsmanship and holistic wellness, the school will be holding the 2025 Annual Sports Day on Friday, 25 July at Yishun Stadium located at 103, Yishun Avenue 1. Students are to report to the venue by 7.30am. The event is expected to end at 11.00am. Students will be dismissed from the venue.

As a precursor to the Sports Day, the school will also be conducting heats for selected students on the first week of Term 3.
