Along with the recent announcement (dated Thursday, 20 January 2022) on our school's name change to St. Margaret's School (Secondary) with effect from 1 January 2023, we also celebrate the 180th year of the founding of our school.

To commemorate this milestone, there will be a host of activities, resonating with our shared heritage, legacy and school motto, which will be organised together with St. Margaret's Primary School. Exciting events to look forward to during the course of the school year include:

Virtual Heritage Trail (Heritage)

To celebrate St. Margaret's rich heritage, audiences will embark on an online adventure to explore a series of sites and places in and around the school, allowing them to discover more about the school's rich history and culture.

Virtual Concert & Family Activity Box (Legacy)

An online concert with its theme aligned to Maria Dyer's legacy of love and service to the community will be organised. We hope that audiences will be enthralled and thoroughly engaged as they participate in the online concert with accompanying interactive elements.

To live out the school motto, "Charity, Patience and Devotion" during our 180th Anniversary, there will be a calendar of activities for staff and students to carry out acts of kindness and love.

Safe Management Measures- Reminders

As we continue to ride the wave of the pandemic, we seek your cooperation to work together to ensure that the school remains a safe place to be in. Please remind your daughter/ward to have a working TraceTogether token with her at all times.

Students who are unwell should seek medical attention as soon as possible. The doctor will then assess the need for a confirmatory Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test or an Antigen Rapid Test (ART) to be administered.

If your daughter/ward tests negative, the doctor will advise her accordingly. If she tests positive, she should avoid coming to school and return to school only upon expiration of her medical certificate. Please inform her Form Teacher of her absence from school as soon as possible. Do refer to https://www.covid.gov.sg for the latest MOH 1-2-3 Protocols.

Should your daughter/ward be a close contact with a COVID-19 positive case or live in the same household with the infected individual, she is legally required to self-isolate immediately and take an ART self-test within 24 hours. She can report to school for the day if the test is negative. Please inform her FT of the ART results.

2021 GCE O-Level Examinations

We congratulate our 2021 graduating cohort for achieving stellar results in the GCE O-Level Examinations. 92% of our Secondary 4 Express students qualified for admission to the Junior Colleges/Millennia Institute and 98% of them qualified for Polytechnic courses.

Our Secondary 5 Normal (Academic) students also did well with 44% of them qualifying for admission to the Junior Colleges/Millennia Institute and 72% of them qualifying for Polytechnic courses.

1. Education and Career Guidance Fair

The Education and Career Guidance (ECG) Fair, comprising a series of activities from now till April, provides our graduating students with the opportunity to explore education and career pathways.

Through the sharing by our partners comprising professionals from various industries and educators from institutes of higher learning, the ECG Fair allows our students to gain awareness of the skills, knowledge and attitudes that allow one to contribute and thrive in the various industries, so as to make informed decisions of the courses to apply for after the national examinations.
